1. CAUSE AND EFFECT QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What caused this event?• What are the consequences of this choice?• What hidden motivations could have generated this effect?	5. PERSONAL AND REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What do you think about this situation?• How would you feel if you were in the main character's shoes?• What would you do in a similar situation?
2. COMPARISON QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• How is A different or the same as B?• What are the pros and cons of this situation?• If we were to merge A and B into one thing, what would it look like?	6. IMAGINATIVE QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• How would you explain this topic a child?• What kind of creative solution would you propose for this situation?• How would the situation change if considered from an optimistic or pessimistic point of view?
3. QUESTIONS FOR CHANGE <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What would happen if we changed a rule / an event / the traits of a certain character?• How might this situation change over time?• How would you imagine this situation in a different environment? E.g. your city, ancient Rome...	7. ANALYSIS QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What are the stages that make up this situation?• What key elements contribute to the success or failure of this project or situation?• How does this mechanism or thought work?
4. QUESTIONS ABOUT SOLUTIONS AND ACTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• How can we solve this problem?• What could we do to improve the situation?• What concrete actions can we propose?	8. MULTIPLE PERSPECTIVE QUESTIONS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• How would a person who lived 100 years ago see this situation?• What would an expert think about this topic?• How would a child or an elderly person react to this problem?
