# Smartphones in the classroom: responsible use

## **Use only as directed by the teacher**

The cell phone is used only when it is part of the teaching activity. At other times, it remains turned off or in silent mode.

## **No distractions**

It is forbidden to use messaging apps, social media, games or make phone calls during class, unless specifically authorized.

## **Respect for the privacy of others**

It is not permitted to photograph, record audio or video of people without their consent.

## **Shared and collaborative use**

When working in a group, the cell phone is a tool for collaboration, not isolation.

## **Access only relevant content**

During the activities, you can only consult sites, apps or tools that are consistent with the topic covered.

## **Protection of personal data**

Do not share sensitive or personal data via cell phone at school.

## **No replacement for human confrontation**

The cell phone is not a substitute for face-to-face conversation, teamwork, or critical thinking.

## **Personal Responsibility**

Each student is responsible for their own device. The school is not obligated to repair, refund, or store phones.

## **Clear consequences in case of abuse**

Incorrect use of the cell phone will result in warnings, temporary suspension of use, or notification to the family.
